Clyde City Council met at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 17, 2023 in Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 222 N. Main Street, Clyde, Ohio. Mayor Doug McCauley called the meeting to order.

Mr. LaBenne explained this is part of the codification process. One section was done by us/Clyde, and the other section is from the ORC. We are looking at a new codifier, that will have additional features.

Mr. Stanley questioned if this process is to have our codes match the ORC (yes). He questioned why we do not just use our codes (the fines received for tickets that are issued goes to wherever the code comes from; if someone goes to jail, the expense goes to wherever the code comes from; this is an annual "housekeeping" process in which we can tweak our codes but we want to match the ORC).

Mr. LaBenne explained this will allow our remaining ARPA funds to have some flexibility for

expenditures.

Mr. LaBenne explained this will allow us to use some ARPA funds towards the revitalization of the downtown area.

Mr. Keegan recalls discussing the purchase of this property previously. The front and back of the building looks like it is in okay shape and it has a new rubber roof. He feels this is a good investment.

Mr. Stanley agrees this is a good investment and is a step towards bringing the downtown area back. He offered his thanks.

Mr. Shay offered thanks to Mr. LaBenne for his vision for revitalization and this proactive purchase.

Mayor McCauley often hears comments from residents of the need to revitalize downtown. He supports this purchase as a step to take control to start the revitalizing of downtown and hopefully other business owners will join in.

Mr. Keegan feels this building is unsafe. He questioned if the building and the concrete slabs will all be removed (yes, it will all be cleaned up as soon as possible).

Mayor McCauley noted this property has not had any improvements made in many years. This purchase fits with our vision for the future and he supports this.

Ordinance No. **2023-12** was read in its entirety.

Mr. LaBenne stated they have been trying to get this building built for the past year or two. COVID delayed this, and the price has gone up over time. We can use a local contractor, and this will allow us to move equipment inside to be stored.

Mr. Keegan questioned if background checks have been done for the contractor (yes).

Mr. Selvey explained that Sourcewell is government approved and offers a price guarantee. Many other cities are using Sourcewell. This is a legal way to circumvent some of the bidding requirements.

Mr. Keegan noted the other CL&P storage building is only seven or eight years old.

Mr. Stanley is glad this building is getting done. It was first approved three years ago at the budget hearings. It will be good to be able to keep the equipment inside.

Mr. Shay requested clarification of the location of this new building (on the CL&P property, southwest of the current CL&P building).

Mayor McCauley announced that this ordinance contained an emergency clause.

Mr. LaBenne stated this request has been fully vetted and has gone through the full process. There have been multiple opportunities for anyone who opposes this request to voice their comments.

Mr. Weasner reported this is standard coverage, the same coverage as in the past. Premiums have increased, five percent with PEP insurance and eight percent with Cincinnati insurance.

Mr. Shay feels it is unfortunate to need employee dishonesty insurance.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Mr. LaBenne gave the following report:

- Resident at the corner of Church/Cherry paid his \$790 bill for yard cleanup services, and we have had some discussions with him about demoing the abandoned home he owns next door and continued maintenance and cleanup of his properties. Conversations have gone well; we need to keep them going and continue to assist and pressure them as necessary to keep this trend going.
- Woodland Avenue Sanitary Sewer Project – Re-Bidding - Advertising for Bids starts Feb 1st thru the 8th, and the bid opening is on Feb 24th.
- OmniFiber – We are getting more calls due to boring strikes, complaints with holes in the yard, etc...fiber splicing trailers have been working long hours, there are two people going door to door (wearing OmniFiber jackets), and there are rumors that we have a few hookups although I am waiting for an official report from Omni.
- Frontier Fiber Project – Tentative start date is April. Re-using existing attachments on our poles, replacing broken poles, or hanging services. They just finished up in Huron, and I plan to call and discuss how this project went for them.

- This year we will be rolling out a host of new online tools to the community, including options for online payments for Zoning variances. Add in a few new initiatives to boot, and 2023 will be a busy year filled with modernizations and changes.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Weasner reported the following updates:

- Reviewed the December financials
 - Revenue, General Fund, Water, Sewer and Electric balances are up compared to 2021; Interest Income is considerably up compared to 2021.
 - Expenses and Sewer balances are down; Income Tax revenue is slightly down compared to 2021.
 - We ended in really good shape for 2022 and are off to a good start to 2023; we are closing out the year
- Mr. Weasner took a moment to share his appreciation for the opportunity to be the Finance Director as he considers it a privilege to work for the City and the residents; he acknowledges that he still has a lot to learn and he is looking forward to more training
- Audit preparations are underway
- We are looking into getting some budgeting software to see how this would work for Clyde; previously Excel sheets have been used for budget preparation
- He will be considering additional investment strategies

COUNCIL REMARKS

By poll of Council and Administration the January 24, 2023 work session is cancelled.

Mr. Keegan spoke about the grain train issues. He shared a concern related to trains that are stopped near Main Street or near the Whirlpool warehouse, left for days with their engines running. This causes undo noise and a constant diesel fuel smell for the residents in these areas. Mr. Winke has not heard any complaints about this, but he will check with a resident who has voiced complaints about this issue in the past.

Mr. Stanley requested confirmation that Frontier is planning to begin running fiber (yes). He is glad there will now be competition for these services.

Mr. Stanley referenced the grain train issues, related to trains blocking the tracks around 3:00 p.m. He questioned if the railroad is calling the City prior to blocking the tracks (unknown, we will ask the dispatcher). This problem is causing some residents to speed, to try to get around the train.

Mr. Stanley feels it has been a mild winter, which is great for the salt budget. He encourages residents to be safe when traveling.

Mr. Shay had previously recommended to purchase an AED for Council Chambers/second floor. He is a certified AED instructor and he offered to train all second floor staff at no cost.

Mr. Shay was a Scout member, and he thanked the Cub Scouts for attending this meeting.

Mr. Shay offered congratulations to Vice Mayor Black and Mayor McCauley for running the first two meetings of the year – great job. Mr. Shay offered appreciation to Mr. Stanley for his leadership in 2022 as Mayor.

Mr. Shay will be glad for residents to have options, with the addition of OmniFiber and Frontier. However, he shared a concern of there being many unsightly cables and wires. He hopes the landscape will not be ruined.

Mayor McCauley thanked all for their patience tonight while he ran his first meeting. His selection as Mayor was unexpected as he did not seek this position. However, he appreciates Council's confidence for this vote. He appreciates the professionalism and civility of this Council. All Council members will not always agree, but that does occur in a Democracy. He is glad to work with the members of this Council and with Administration. He extended thanks to Mr. Weasner for his leadership in the area of Finance.

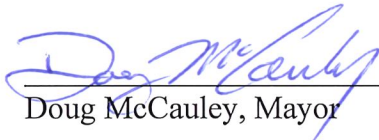

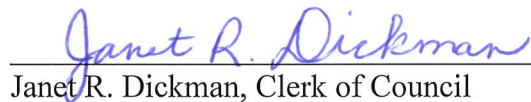
