

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-51

CITY OF CLYDE, OHIO

ESTABLISHING THE CLYDE DOWNTOWN DESIGNATED OUTDOOR REFRESHMENT AREA ("DORA") PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE § 4301.82 AND ADOPTING PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.

WHEREAS Ohio Revised Code § 4301.82 authorizes the legislative authority of a municipal corporation to establish a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area ("DORA") upon proper application and public notice; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clyde has a population of approximately 6,300 persons as reflected by the most recent regular federal decennial census, and is therefore a municipal corporation with a population of 50,000 or less eligible to establish up to three (3) DORAs not exceeding 320 contiguous acres each, requiring a minimum of two (2) qualified permit holders per ORC § 4301.82(D); and

WHEREAS the City Manager has filed an application with this Council to establish the Clyde Downtown Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area; and

WHEREAS notice of the application has been published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Clyde as required by ORC § 4301.82(C), and the notice stated that the application was on file in the office of the City Clerk and available for public inspection; and

WHEREAS City Council held a public hearing on the application on May 19, 2026; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that the application meets all requirements of ORC § 4301.82, that the proposed DORA encompasses areas within the Central Business District (C-1) and Residential Office (R-O) zoning classifications consistent with the City's master zoning plan, that at least two (2) qualified permit holders are located within the proposed area; and

WHEREAS City Council finds it necessary to adopt this resolution to facilitate the timely establishment of the DORA and the promotion of economic development during America's 250th Celebration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Clyde, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. This Council hereby approves and accepts the application for a DORA submitted by the City Manager and that a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area, to be known as the "Clyde Downtown Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area" (the "Clyde Downtown DORA"), is hereby created in accordance with Ohio Revised Code § 4301.82.

SECTION 2. The specific boundaries of the Clyde Downtown DORA are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A. The DORA encompasses areas within the Central Business District (C-1) and Residential Office (R-O) zoning districts of the City of Clyde. The official boundary map on file with the City Manager's office is controlling.

SECTION 3. The Clyde Downtown DORA shall be active year-round during the following hours:

- Monday through Saturday: 12:00 p.m. (Noon) to 10:00 p.m.

Outside of the active hours listed above, the open container exemption does not apply, and ORC § 4301.62 governs. City Council may, by resolution adopted not less than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the event, authorize expanded DORA hours for designated civic events or community celebrations within the DORA boundaries, provided that such expanded hours do not exceed the limitations imposed by individual permit holders' liquor licenses.

SECTION 4. A detailed Public Health and Safety Plan is set forth in Exhibit B and is incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 5. The following establishments hold qualifying liquor permits and are located within the Clyde Downtown DORA boundaries. Each such establishment is eligible to apply to the Ohio Division of Liquor Control for a DORA designation upon approval of this Resolution:

- Alley in Clyde LLC — 117 W. Buckeye St. — Permit Type: D-5.
- Blue Collar Bistro LLC — 111 N. Main St — Permit Types: D-2, D-2X, D-3, D-3A.
- Town Tavern — 105 N. Main St. — Permit Type: D-5.
- Loom Lodge 0393 Clyde— 134 Eaton Ave. — D-4, D-6.

Holders of F-class permits sponsoring events within the Clyde Downtown DORA may apply to the Ohio Division of Liquor Control for a DORA designation for those events, subject to ORC § 4301.82(G).

SECTION 6. Each qualified permit holder within the Clyde Downtown DORA shall remain subject to Ohio Revised Code § 4399.18 in the same manner as if the permit holder were not located in a designated outdoor refreshment area, as required by ORC § 4301.82(H).

EXHIBIT B
PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN
Clyde Downtown Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area
City of Clyde, Sandusky County, Ohio

This Public Health and Safety Plan ("Plan") is adopted pursuant to Ohio Revised Code § 4301.82(F)(1) as a required component of the Clyde Downtown DORA. This Plan is incorporated by reference into the DORA Application and the establishing Resolution and shall be filed with the Ohio Division of Liquor Control and the Investigative Unit of the Ohio Department of Public Safety.

SECTION A. BOUNDARIES

The specific boundaries of the Clyde Downtown DORA, including street addresses, are depicted on the official DORA Map attached as Exhibit A. The DORA encompasses areas within the Central Business District (C-1) and Residential Office (R-O) zoning districts of the City of Clyde. Those descriptions are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION B. SIGNAGE

Each sidewalk that crosses the DORA boundary shall be marked, within a reasonable distance of the boundary, with 12" x 18" signage which shall clearly designate the boundary of the DORA, set forth the hours of operation of the Area, and state that alcoholic beverages are not permitted beyond the sign.

Qualified Permit Holders shall post participation notices at their entrances.

SECTION C. PERSONNEL

The Clyde Police Department will be responsible for providing public safety within the DORA through law enforcement services, with staffing determined to be sufficient by the Chief of Police. For planned events in the DORA that may draw a larger-than-normal attendance, the Chief of Police may have additional officers and/or other agency personnel assigned specifically to the DORA. Under the direction of the City Manager and Chief of Police, all City departments will be responsible for ensuring the thoughtful implementation of public safety and sanitation requirements through typical staffing. For planned events in the DORA that may draw a larger-than-normal attendance, the City Manager or Chief of Police may assign staff additional duties as required to ensure public health and safety.

SECTION D. SANITATION PLAN

The following sanitation plan is hereby adopted, which shall maintain the appearance and public health of the Clyde Downtown DORA:

- Rubbish, garbage, and other materials shall not be stored or allowed to accumulate in passageways, doorways, streets, or any areas of the DORA.

- The DORA is already equipped with trash receptacles throughout the downtown area that are regularly serviced. If more are determined to be necessary for a special event, they shall be provided and serviced by the event organizer.
- Each qualified permit holder located in the DORA shall be responsible for the collection of litter and trash near or around the premises occupied by the permit holder, including both public and private areas.
- The City Manager shall evaluate the need and frequency of street sweeping and servicing of trash receptacles and, at their discretion, implement any changes or modifications to the sanitation plan for the duration of the DORA's existence.

SECTION E. CONTAINER REQUIREMENTS

- Pursuant to ORC § 4301.82(F)(1)(g), alcoholic beverages consumed outdoors within the Clyde Downtown DORA shall be required to be served solely in plastic bottles or other non-glass, non-aluminum Official DORA Cups.
- Official DORA Cups shall be specifically designated containers provided by either the City of Clyde or a downtown business organization operating under an appropriate agreement with the City Manager ("official cups").
- The official cups shall be distinctly marked with branding approved by the City Manager. No other container will be permitted.
- Used cups must be disposed of before entering any establishment owned or operated by a qualified permit holder.
- No glass, canned, or non-DORA-cup beverage containers shall be permitted for outdoor consumption within the DORA. The maximum container size is sixteen (16) fluid ounces.
- Only one (1) open container per person is permitted at any time.

SECTION F. OTHER PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

- Age Verification: Qualified Permit Holders shall verify that patrons are at least 21 years of age before serving DORA Beverages, consistent with all state law requirements.
- No Motor Vehicle Possession: Open containers shall not be possessed within motor vehicles within the DORA.
- Emergency Response: The City shall ensure that emergency vehicle access routes within and adjacent to the DORA are maintained clear at all times. No vendor, event setup, or patron congregation shall block an emergency access route.
- ADA Compliance: The DORA shall be operated in a manner consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Refuse receptacles and signage shall be placed to avoid obstructing accessible pedestrian routes.
- Annual Review of Safety Plan: The City Manager or designee shall review this Plan annually and recommend amendments to City Council as warranted.

- Responsible Service Training Requirement — Condition of DORA Participation. As a condition of initial and continued participation in the Clyde Downtown Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area, each Qualified Permit Holder shall satisfy the following responsible alcohol service training requirements:
 - Pre-Service Certification. All employees authorized to serve, sell, or dispense alcoholic beverages within the DORA shall hold a current certification from a recognized responsible alcohol service training program. Acceptable certifications include TIPS (Training for Intervention ProcedureS), ServSafe Alcohol, RAMP, or an equivalent program recognized by the Ohio Division of Liquor Control or NHTSA. Certification must be obtained prior to the employee's first service of a DORA Beverage.
 - Renewal. Certifications shall be renewed in accordance with the issuing program's renewal schedule, and in no event less frequently than every three (3) years. No employee whose certification has lapsed shall serve DORA Beverages pending renewal.
 - Records Maintenance. Each Qualified Permit Holder shall maintain current and accurate records of all employee certifications, including the employee's name, the training program completed, the date of completion, and the certification expiration date. Records shall be maintained on the premises and produced to the City Manager, the Chief of Police, or their designee upon request and without prior notice.
 - Annual Attestation. On or before March 1 of each year, each Qualified Permit Holder shall submit a signed written attestation to the City Manager confirming that all currently employed servers hold valid certifications as required by this section. The attestation form shall be provided by the City.
 - Failure to Comply. A Qualified Permit Holder's failure to maintain employee certifications as required by this section, or failure to produce records upon request, shall constitute grounds for suspension of DORA participation privileges by the City Manager, pending cure. A second or subsequent violation within any 24-month period may be reported to the Ohio Division of Liquor Control for investigation consistent with ORC Chapter 4303.

SECTION G. NOTICE TO OHIO DIVISION OF LIQUOR CONTROL

Upon adoption of the establishing Resolution, the City Clerk shall transmit this Plan and the Resolution to:

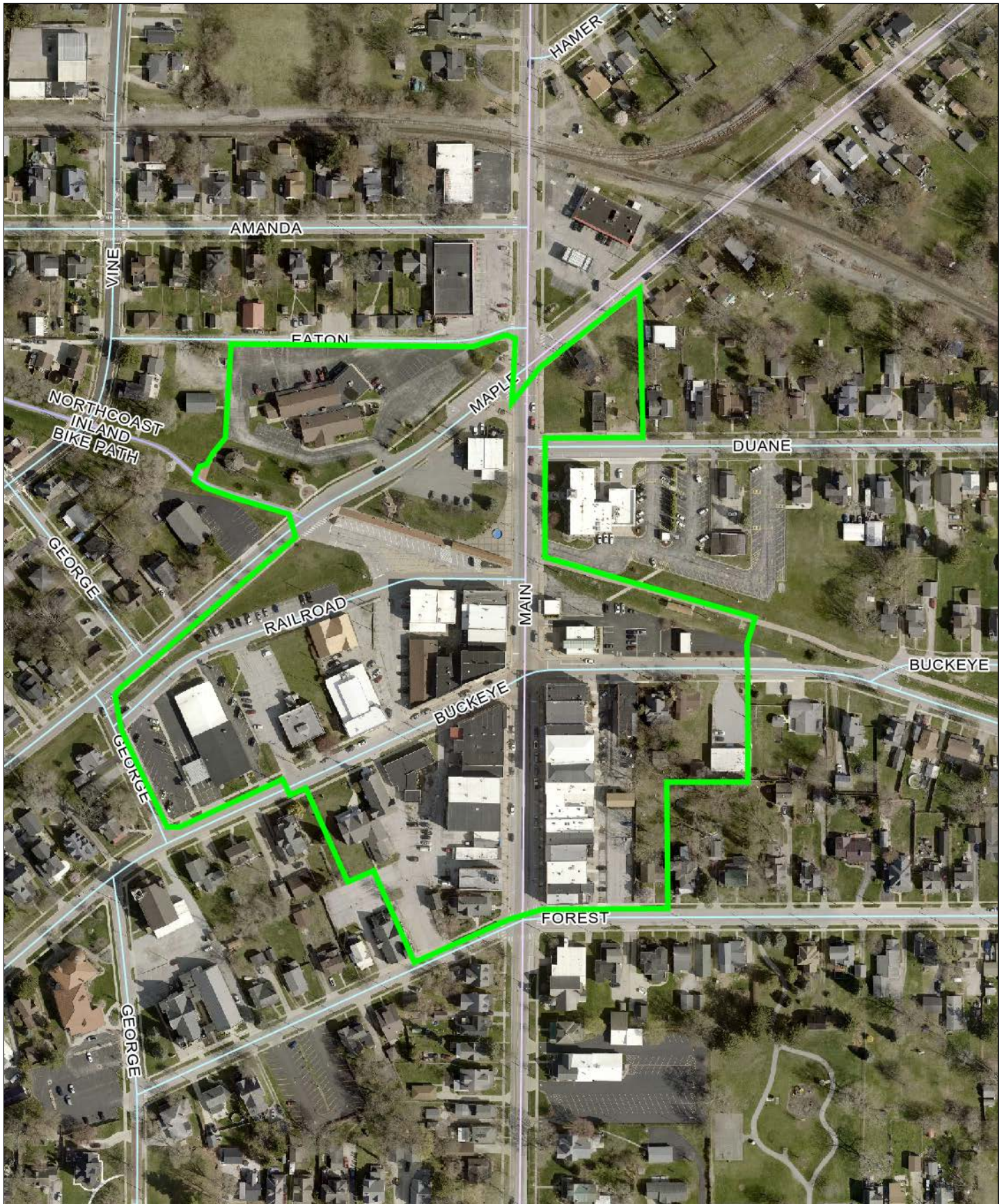
